

Potassium	3.5-5.0 mEq/L
Chloride	96-106 mEq/L
Carbon Dioxide	20-29 mEq/L
BUN (blood urea nitrogen)	7-18 mg/dL
Creatinine	0.6-1.2 mg/dL
Glucose	70-100 mg/dL
CD4 Cell Count	500-1200 cells/mm ₃
Hemoglobin (Hb)	12.1-15.1 g/dL (female) 13.8-17.2 g/dL (male)

CASE-SPECIFIC TERMS

PrEP	Pre-exposure prophylaxis (or PrEP) is a way for people who do not have HIV but who are at very high risk of getting HIV to prevent HIV infection by taking a pill every day.	
PEP	Post-exposure prophylaxis	
ART Therapy	Antiretroviral therapy (ART) is the use of HIV medicines to treat HIV infection	
Oral candidiasis/thrush	An infection in which the fungus Candida albicans accumulates in the mouth.	
CD4 (lab value)	T-cell count	
Hemorrhoids	Swollen and inflamed veins in the rectum and anus that cause discomfort and bleeding	
Syphilis	a chronic bacterial disease that is contracted chiefly by infection during sexual intercourse	
F/C/S	Fever, chills, sweating	
Hernia	A condition in which soft tissue bulges through a weak point in the abdominal muscles.

Clotrimazole	Imidazole	Antifungal for oral candidiasis
Chantix (varenicline)	Smoking cessation agent	Smoking cessation
Albuterol HFA	Bronchodilators	Asthma
Bactrim DS	Antibiotic	Pneumocystis jiroveci Pneumonia (PJP) prophylaxis
Biktarvy	Single-Tablet Regimens	HIV
Doxycycline	Antibiotic	Syphilis
Zoster	Vaccine	Herpes zoster/shingles
TDaP	Vaccine	Tetanus, diphtheria & pertussis
